

The European Commission:

• adopted a proposal for a Regulation on transparency and

sustainability of EU risk assessment in the food chain. The Regulation was adopted by the European Parliament and the Council in June 2019. The new legislation started applying in March 2021;

 announced measures to make the process to authorise, restrict or ban the use of pesticides more transparent, focusing on implementing the Directive on Sustainable Use of Pesticides and establishing harmonised risk indicators under Directive 2009/128/EC.
