



MICHIGAN STATE UNIVERSITY'S Mandatory Reporting of Relationship Violence, Sexual Misconduct and Stalking Policy

What is it?

- A new standalone policy which replaces the current reporting protocol
- Provides clarity on who needs to report, what needs to be reported and removes the dual reporting to MSU Police unless required under additional policies or is an emergency
- Provides link to grievance procedures for mandatory reporting violations

Who must report?

All University Employees	✓
Student Employees	✓
Volunteers	✓
Employees Exempt During the Provisions of Services	✗

What to report?

- 1 Relationship violence, sexual misconduct and/or stalking incident
- 2 Observed or learned about in your working or professional capacity
- 3 Incident occurred at: University-sponsored event or On university property Or involves a University community member while they were a University community member
