Slovakia

1. COUNTRY HIGHLIGHTS

Close to seven in ten respondents in Slovakia say that climate change is a “very serious” problem (68%). When comparing it with other issues, 13% identify it as the most serious problem facing the world (close to the EU average of 15%). Nearly half believe that government and business should be responsible for tackling climate change (both 48%).

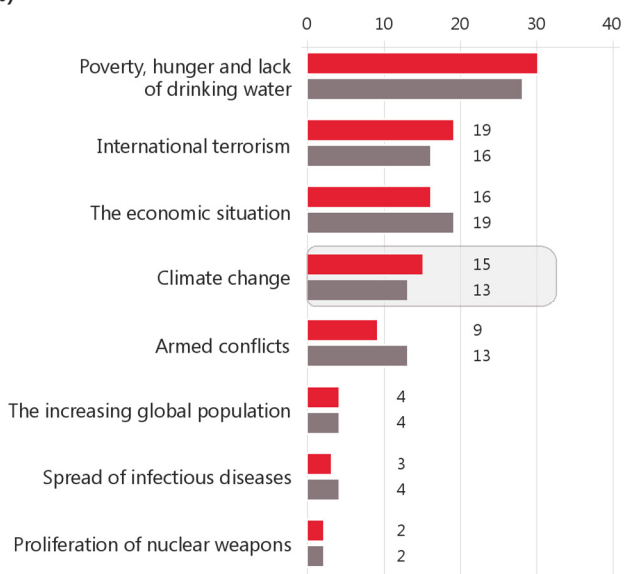
More than four in ten respondents say they have personally taken some action to fight climate change in the past six months (43%, below the EU average of 49%). However, when presented with a list of specific measures, 93% reveal they have carried out at least one action. The main practical measures taken are:

- Trying to reduce waste and regularly separate it for recycling (70%)
- Trying to cut down consumption of disposable items whenever possible (51%)
- Buying locally produced food whenever possible. This measure has gained significant ground since 2013 (49%, +16 percentage points since 2013)

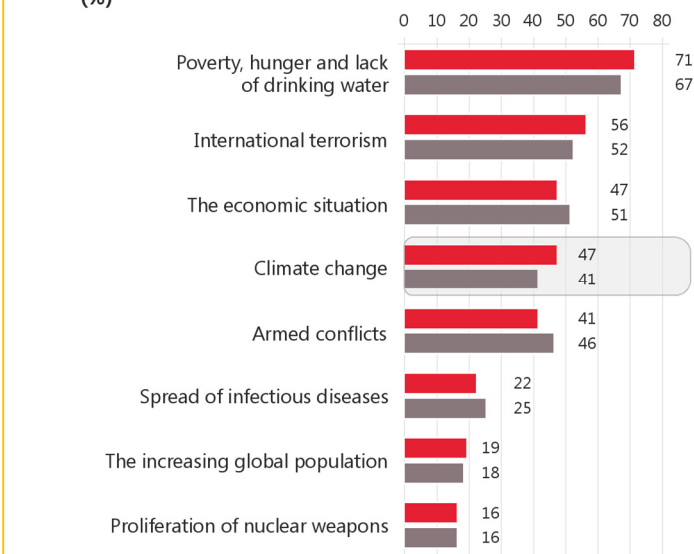
There is a strong consensus (83%) that fighting climate change and using energy more efficiently can boost the economy and create jobs. More than nine in ten respondents (94%) agree that fighting climate change will only be effective if all countries of the world act together.

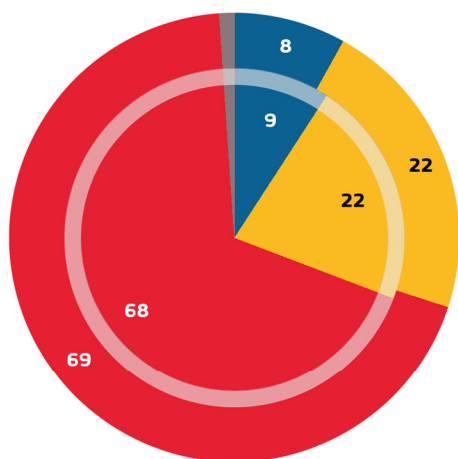

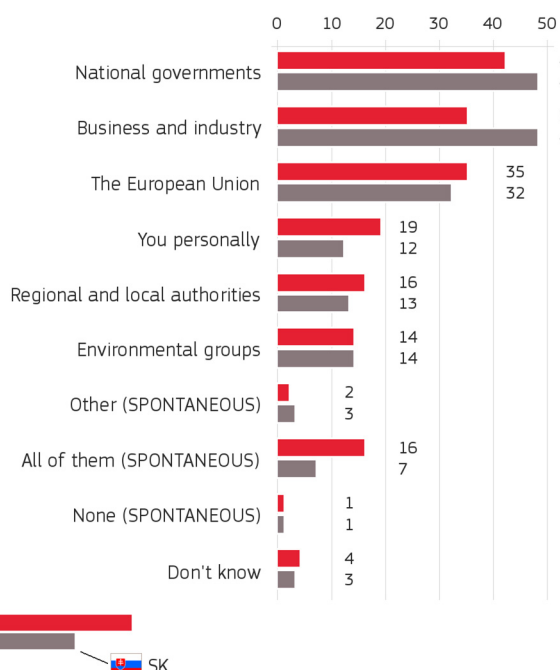

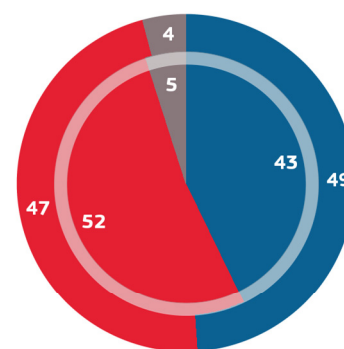
QA3 In your opinion, who within the EU is responsible for tackling climate change? (MULTIPLE ANSWERS POSSIBLE)

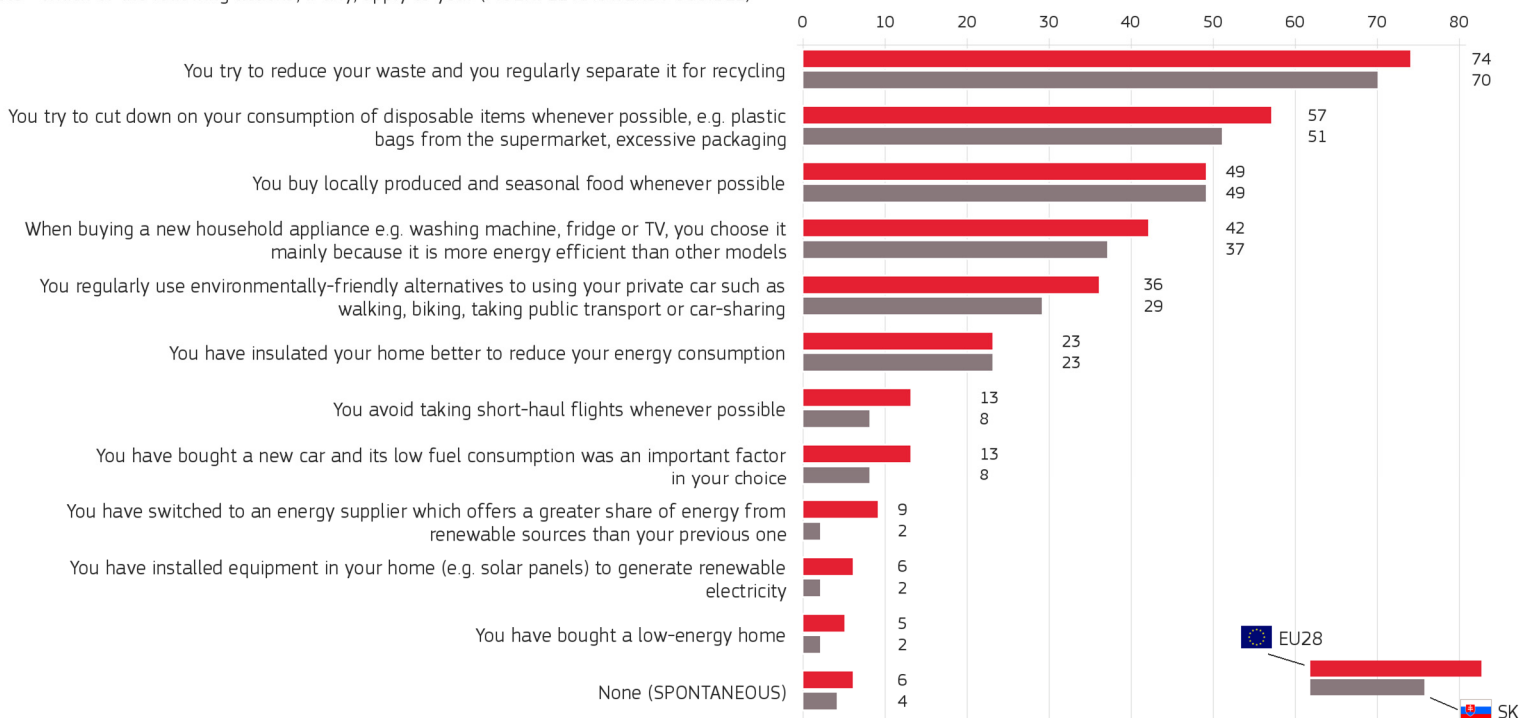

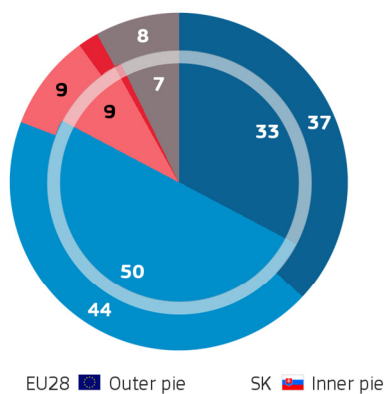
QA6 Which of the following actions, if any, apply to you? (MULTIPLE ANSWERS POSSIBLE)

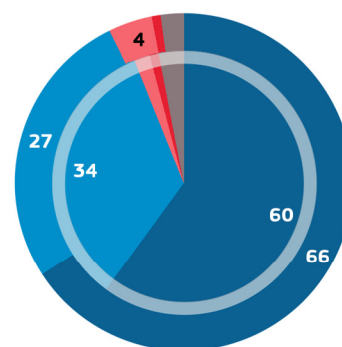

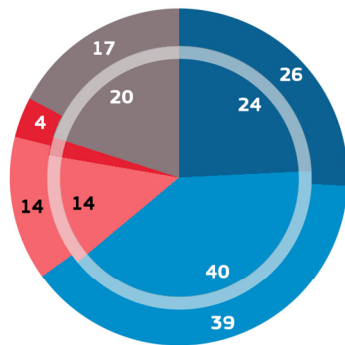

Reducing fossil fuel imports from outside the EU can benefit the EU economically (%)

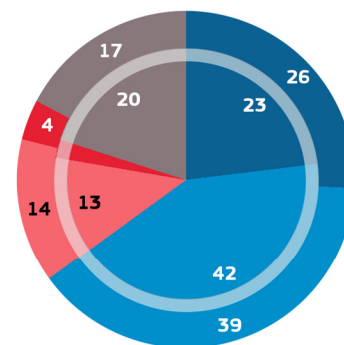

Reducing fossil fuel imports from outside the EU can increase the security of EU energy supplies (%)



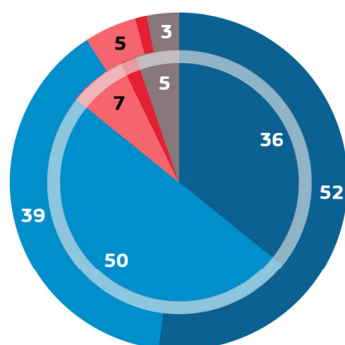

(%)

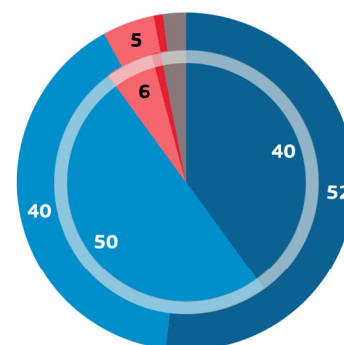
