Kent County, founded in 1642, sits directly east of Baltimore and the Chesapeake Bay, with Washington DC 50 miles to the southwest and Philadelphia 60 miles to the northeast. The county is located within 90 minutes of three international airports and three major seaports. Route 301 links Maryland to Delaware, thus making Kent County a prime location for warehouse and distribution operations and commercial transportation. The county's private sector industries generate over \$1 billion in gross regional product in 2022.



With its diverse business landscape, affordable land, and low cost of living, it is a great place for businesses and new residents. Kent County is one of only five counties in Maryland with no personal property tax. Investing in its open-access fiber broadband availability, encourages the growth of diverse businesses such as datacenters, call centers, cyber security, telemedicine, training, and education centers. The Chestertown Business Campus, a premier economic development project, offers opportunities to attract new and expanding businesses
