OVERALL APPROACH

- Following Better Regulation Guidelines of the EC
- Assessing environmental, social and economic impacts of options and simplifications
- Mix of qualitative and semi-quantitative, and where possible quantitative assessments
- Monetisation of anticipated costs from compliance, administrative activities and enforcement where feasible and relevant
- Building on literature review and stakeholder consultations
- Business as usual/status quo scenario will take into account other related policies, strategies and contextual factors (COVID19, climate change, population growth)

- Discussions with experts from research, policymaker and international organisations to identify impacts of policy options
- Topics:

 - Cost impacts on actors in the agricultural value chain
 - Economic impact on societies
 - Impacts on non-EU countries
 - Impacts on non-agricultural users
 - Increasing uptake and monitoring of IPM
 - Contribution of precision farming to the sustainable use of pesticides





CASE-BASED FACT FINDING



- Case based approach using experiences from Member States that have implemented additional measures:
 - Prescription systems
 - Taxation
 - Ban of non-professional use
 - Ban of use on public space
 - Independent advisory services
 - IPM record keeping
- Ad-hoc interviews for to collect evidence on costs and benefits to feed into the impact assessment
- Extrapolation of effects to the EU level, using evidence from the cases
