



Figure diagramming the wheel-work of the Antikythera mechanism by Derek de-Solla Price (Yale University).






The Cone of Increasing Diversity



Decimation and Diversification








Darwinian creatures, different




Skinnerian creature "blindly" tries different responses . . .

Next time, the creature's first choice will be the reinforced response.




