Introduction to intellectual property rights

- Intellectual property (IP) = creations of the mind, such as inventions, literary and artistic works, designs, and symbols, names or images
- Intellectual property rights = rights giving control over intellectual property excluding others from using the IP

Why IP matters – four reasons to patent

1. Market access

- Protecting from imitators and free riders
- Ensuring freedom to operate and reducing the risk of infringing rights of others
- Enhancing reputation

2. Negotiating

- Strengthening negotiation position enabling cooperation
- Monetization through licensing, cross-licensing, joint ventures, etc.

3. Funding

- Attracting investors, access to grants

4. Strategic value

- Enhancing company value and improving competitive edge
- Capturing the value of R&D investments



IP in your Pathfinder proposal

Criterion 2: Impact

- Describe the measures for a plausible path to commercialise the innovations
- Specify your strategy for the management of intellectual property, foreseen protection measures, such as patents, design rights, copyright, trade secrets, etc. How adequate are they to support exploitation?
- -> IP strategy

Evaluation:

EIC Pathfinder Open: How adequate are the proposed measures for protection of results and any other exploitation measures to facilitate future translation of research results into innovations? (open)

EIC Pathfinder Challenges: How adequate are the proposed measures for protection of results and any other exploitation measures to facilitate future translation of research results into innovations with positive societal, economic or environmental impact?



IP provisions in the HE Grant Agreement – Annex 5

• IP issues (incl. ownership and co-ownership of results, identification of background, etc.) must be regulated in a **consortium agreement**

Access to background

- The beneficiaries must identify in a written agreement the background as needed for implementing the action or for exploiting its results
- Beneficiaries must grant each other access to all background (incl. IP rights) needed

Ownership of results - default based on the GA

- Results are owned by the beneficiaries that generate them. Jointly generated results are owned by joint owners.
- Each joint owner may grant non-exclusive licences to third parties to exploit the jointly-owned results (without any right to sub-license)
 - if the other joint owners are given at least 45 days advance notice and
 - fair and reasonable compensation.



IP provisions in the HE Grant Agreement – Annex 5

Obligations of beneficiaries based on the GA

- If results are owned jointly, beneficiaries must agree on the allocation and terms of exercise of their joint ownership ('joint ownership agreement')
- The beneficiaries must indicate the owner(s) of the results (results ownership list) in the final periodic report continuous reporting tab "Results" in SyGMa

Protection of results and exploitation

- Beneficiaries must adequately protect their results for an appropriate period and with appropriate territorial coverage continuous reporting tab "IPR" in SyGMa
- Beneficiaries must, **up to four years after the end of the action**, use their best efforts to **exploit their results directly** or to have them exploited indirectly by another entity, in particular through transfer or licensing.
- If, the results are not exploited within one year after the end of the action, the beneficiaries must use the Horizon Results Platform to find interested parties to exploit the results.



IP provisions in the HE Grant Agreement – Annex 5

Transfer of ownership

 Transfer of ownership of results is in principle possible, other beneficiaries with access rights have the right to object

Licensing

- Exclusive licenses are possible provided that other beneficiaries concerned have waived their rights
- Beneficiaries who intend to transfer ownership or grant an exclusive licence **must formally notify the granting authority**, who has the right to object if:
 - It is to a legal entity established in a non-EU country not associated with the Horizon Europe
 - The granting authority considers that the transfer or licence is not in line with EU interests

Access to foreground

- The beneficiaries must grant each other access on a royalty-free basis to results needed for implementing their own tasks under the action.
- The beneficiaries must grant each other access under fair and reasonable conditions to results needed for exploiting their results.



IP in project deliverables and reporting (HE)

Projects are expected to submit and update:

- Data management plan specifies how data will be handled during the project, and among others, which data will be treated as confidential
- Exploitation plan should explain how IP will support exploitation
- Communication and dissemination plan relates to results that do not need to be IP protected

Reporting:

SyGMa tabs (Results, IPR) should always be updated

IPR status must also be reported in every periodic reporting

Innovation Radar Report (produced by the IR expert) – identifies main innovations from the project and generated IPRs

- Eligible cost up to 7.000€ reimbursable from your EIC Pathfinder / FET Open grant
- 50% direct reimbursement through the **EIC ACCESS**+ grant
- Fields of application:
 - Due diligence before investment process
 - Refinement of your IP strategy
 - Advice on the registrability of your IP rights
 - Support in commercialization licensing, etc.
 - Clarification of IP rights ownership in a complicated set up of partners...

Unitary Patent





Unitary Patent

- European Patent with unitary effect
- Provides protection currently in 18 countries
- In the future up to 25 countries (all EU member states except Croatia and Spain)
- Based on a granted European Patent (EP), registered by the European Patent Office

Filing Search Examination EP Granted Request by the holder Unitary Patent

- Difference to the "classical" European Patent:
- EP validated in each country separately (bundle patent) and can still be litigated at national courts X
- UP is registered in one single procedure and litigation takes place at the Unified Patent Court with effect in the whole territory of the participating member states



Unitary Patent - implications

Cost optimisation

- No fees for the request for unitary effect
- Renewal fees are under 5.000€ -> less expensive than an EP validated and maintained in 4 countries, while being valid in all (currently) 18 countries
- Financial support for SMEs available to compensate for translation fees
- Only 1 translation required
- One single register savings on maintenance fees
- One single litigation procedure for the whole territory

Other considerations

- Unitary Patent may be revoked / preliminary injunction imposed in one single procedure
- No possibility to limit territorial scope as in case of the European Patent
- Litigation may be more expensive than in one single country
