Discontinuation of Francisella tularensis antibody testing

Due to reagents unavailability, effective April 15, 2024, the Maryland Department of Health, Laboratories Administration will discontinue *Francisella tularensis* antibody testing which was part of our Tickborne Panel. Although the assay will be discontinued, we will continue to ship *Francisella tularensis* serology requests to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) for analysis.

According to current CDC specimen submission requirements, the specimen must be stored at 2-8 °C for up to 14 days post-collection, stored at -20 °C or lower for up to 60 days, or held at -70 °C or lower for up to 9 months prior to shipment.
