Hello Students,

Some of you may have heard that U.S. Secretary of Education Betsy DeVos announced more than \$6 billion will be distributed immediately to colleges and universities to provide direct emergency cash grants to college students whose lives and educations have been disrupted by the coronavirus outbreak. The funding is available through the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund authorized by the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act, signed into law by President Donald J. Trump. The U.S. Department of Education has made Emergency Financial Aid Grants available to **students of our institution** who need financial support for their expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to Coronavirus.

What this means for L3Harris students?

If you have incurred expenses due to the disruption caused by the Coronavirus pandemic you can apply for the emergency grant. The following application process is required.

Who is eligible to apply?

Any student enrolled in Professional Pilot Program, Airline Pilot Track, or Commercial Pilot Track and are US citizens or eligible non-citizens who were affected by COVID-19 should be eligible to apply. Student's eligibility will be determined based on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Student must be actively training more than half-time.

Not eligible: Stand-alone courses or any student on LOA.

How do I apply for the grant?

- You must complete the attached L3HARRIS Emergency Grant Application and submit to the Student Services
 Department, drop off or email. The Manager of Student Affairs and the Career Services Specialist have paper
 applications if needed.
- You must also submit the **2019-2020 FAFSA** at <u>www.studentaid.gov</u>; school code 041571.

If you have already completed the 19/20 FAFSA with the Financial Aid Department you will not need to resubmit. If you have any questions regarding FAFSA please email Savanna.Folan@L3Harris.com or Miriam.Green@L3Harris.com

How long will it take to receive the grant once my application has been submitted?

Once the application has been submitted the Student Services Department will verify the information listed. Student Services will then submit to the Financial Aid Department to verify the FAFSA. Once all information is verified the Financial Aid Department will calculate the amount and send the student an award notice. Once student receives the notice the finance department will have 14 days to issue the funds to students via check or direct deposit. If Financial Aid is waiting on a FAFSA it could take up to 2 weeks to review before you receive an award notice, student may be required to submit documentation for FAFSA verification.

How much of the grant will I receive?

The calculated amount will be determined on the need of the student. The amount a student could receive is up to \$800. Amounts will vary and each application is reviewed case-by-case. Funds are limited and will be awarded until depleted.
