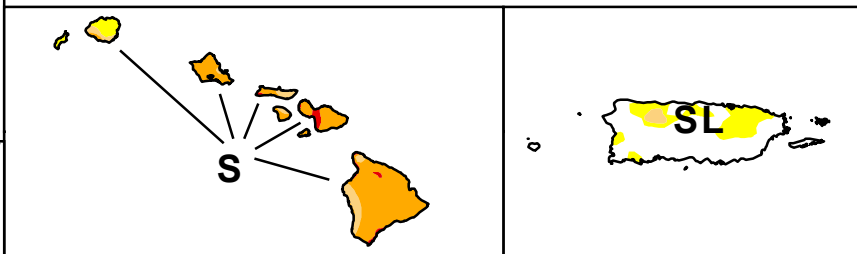
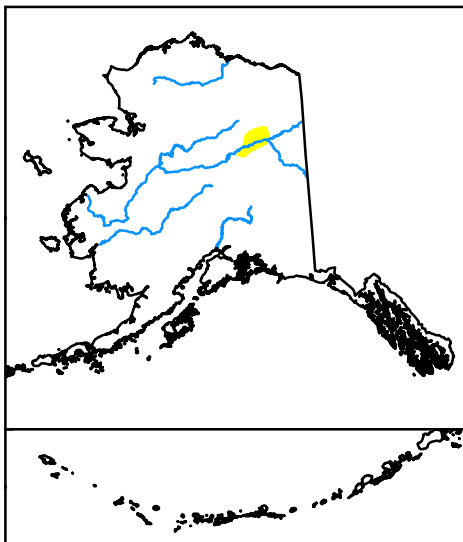
Drought Impact Types:

- L** = Long-Term, typically greater than 6 months (e.g. hydrology, ecology)

-  D1 Moderate Drought
-  D2 Severe Drought
-  D3 Extreme Drought
-  D4 Exceptional Drought

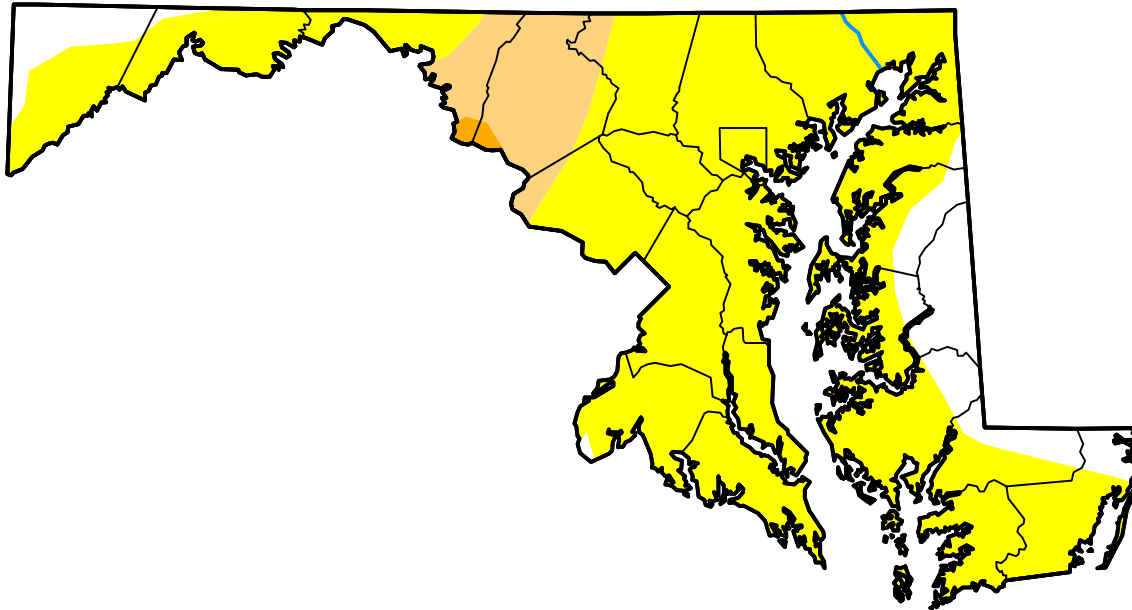
