## 2. STATE OF THE SYSTEM: ENROLLMENT AND GRADUATION

Interim Chancellor Patricia Charlton will present information on enrollment and graduation across the Nevada System of Higher Education. The presentation will include enrollment trends at the national and NSHE levels, including historically underrepresented student populations, an overview of graduation rates over the last several decades, and the recently developed NSHE Outcomes Measure that follow students over a period of time regardless of initial enrollment status. #### 5. HANDBOOK REVISION AND CODE **AMENDMENTS, POLICY AGAINST UNLAWFUL DISCRIMINATION AND HARASSMENT: COMPLAINT PROCEDURE**

Senior Associate General Counsel Lynda King will present for approval a revision to Board policy (Title 4, Chapter 8, Section 14) necessary to comply with the vacatur of the U.S. Department of Education's 2024 Title IX regulations, and conforming corollary amendments to disciplinary procedures in the NSHE Code (Title 2, Chapters 6 and 10) on a temporary and emergency basis, pursuant to Title 2, Chapter 1, Section 1.3.3(b) of the Code. (Refs BOR-5a, BOR-5b, BOR-5c and BOR-5d)

FISCAL IMPACT: The costs associated with the organizational changes within the TIX Offices systemwide to keep up with the constant regulatory changes are currently not quantifiable, but do/will exist.

#### 6. **CONSTRUCTION OF THEATRE, EASTVIEW** FOR POSSIBLE ACTION PHASE 1, TMCC

Truckee Meadows Community College President Karin M. Hilgersom will request approval of the EastView Phase 1 theatre project and funding plan, which includes an allocation of Capital Improvement Fee funds in the amount of up to \$7,346,000. (Ref. BOR-6)

FISCAL IMPACT: TMCC is estimated to expend \$16,958,521 in institutional resources in order to complete this project. Of the total amount, TMCC will expend \$7,346,000 from the Capital Improvement Fee. All funding sources come from CIF, Investment Income, and Self-supporting accounts.

#### 7. **PROCEDURES AND GUIDELINES MANUAL REVISION, DIFFERENTIAL PROGRAM FEES,** UNLV

University of Nevada, Las Vegas President Keith E. Whitfield will request approval of revisions to the Procedures and Guidelines Manual (Chapter 7, Section 10) proposing differential program fees at UNLV. (Refs. BOR-7a, BOR-7b, BOR-7c, BOR-7d, BOR-7e, BOR-7f, BOR-7g and BOR-7h)

FISCAL IMPACT: Differential program fees represent extraordinary costs associated with specific programs. Differential program fee supported budgets that meet the reporting threshold of \$250,000 will be reported in the Self-Supporting Budget report.
