INTEGRATED MONITORING INITIATIVE FOR SDG6

This UN-Water IMI-SDG6 initiative supports countries in monitoring water- and sanitation-related issues and in compiling country data to report on global progress towards SDG6.

SDG6 GLOBAL ACCELERATION FRAMEWORK

This is a unifying initiative that aims to deliver fast results, at an increased scale, towards the goal of ensuring the availability and sustainable management of water and sanitation for all by 2030. Launched in 202 as the Secretary-General's Decade of Action to deliver the SDGs, the SDG6 Global Acceleration Framework mobilizes UN agencies, governments, civil society, private sector, and other stakeholders around five cross-cutting and interdependent "accelerators".

TRANSBOUNDARY WATER COOPERATION COALITION

Governments, UN entities and other organizations have launched a global coalition to better manage cross-border water resources - a lifeline for sustainable development but also a potential source of disputes. The Coalition is a multi-stakeholder partnership that has set itself the objective of highlighting the critical importance of cooperating over shared water resources at a time when it has become imperative to ensure water security and sustainable development.



THE HAND HYGIENE FOR ALL GLOBAL INITIATIVE

This initiative aims to implement WHO's global recommendations on hand hygiene to prevent and control the COVID-19 pandemic and work to ensure lasting infrastructure and behavior. It calls for countries to lay out comprehensive roadmaps that bridge together national COVID-19 preparedness and response plans with mid- and long-term national development plans to ensure hand hygiene is a mainstay beyond the pandemic, as part of infection prevention and control (IPC) and water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH) efforts. It also proposes a framework for coordination and collaboration among global and regional partners, with the primary aim of supporting and growing country-led efforts and investments.

SDG6 CAPACITY DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVE

Established in March 2021, this inter-agency coordination platform on fresh-water, sanitation, and hygiene-related capacity development work enables the UN system and its multi-stakeholder partners to "deliver as one". It responds to countries' specific SDG6 capacity development needs by facilitating support from the UN system and other development partners at various levels of operation.
