Since its launch in 2016, the <u>Kiribati</u>
Road Rehabilitation Project (KRRP)
improved the only main road through
South Tarawa, which is used by the
island's entire population of 50,000
people. The <u>Outer Islands Transport</u>
Infrastructure Investment Project
aims to improve the safety and climate
resilience of transport infrastructure
on selected outer islands, and focuses
on the maritime and road sectors.
