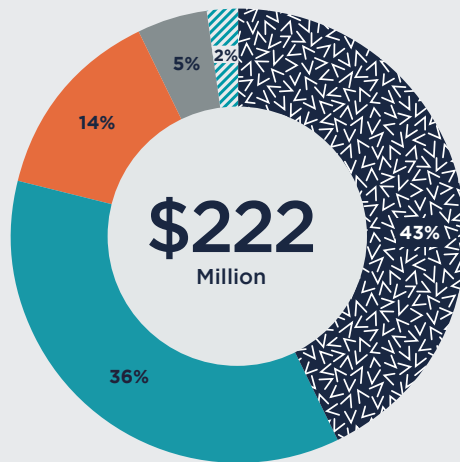


Federated States of Micronesia (FSM)
