Jutta Treviranus is the Director of the Inclusive Design Research Centre (<http://idrc.ocadu.ca>) which she established in 1993 as the nexus of a growing global community that proactively works to ensure that our digitally transformed and globally connected society is designed inclusively. Dr. Treviranus also founded an innovative graduate program in inclusive design at OCAD University in Toronto. Jutta is credited with developing an inclusive co-design methodology that has been adopted by organizations internationally. Jutta has coordinated many research networks with and by people with disabilities. Jutta was recognized for her work in AI by [Women in AI](#) with the [AI for Good - DEI AI Leader of the Year award](#) as well as by [Women in AI Ethics](#). She is the chair of the [Accessible and Equitable Artificial Intelligence standards committee](#) for the Accessible Canada Act.

Kave Noori is passionate about making AI accessible to everyone. As AI Policy Officer at the European Disability Forum, he advocates for disability-inclusive AI and digital rights.
