Amendments by Parliament set out in two columns



The first and second lines of the header of each amendment identify the relevant part of the draft act under consideration. If an amendment pertains to an existing act that the draft act is seeking to amend, the amendment heading includes a third line identifying the existing act and a fourth line identifying the provision in that act that Parliament wishes to amend.

Amendments by Parliament in the form of a consolidated text




on the draft Council decision establishing the Employment Committee and repealing Decision 2000/98/EC

(05125/2015 - C8-0026/2015 - 2015/0801(CNS))

(Special legislative procedure – consultation)

The European Parliament,

- having regard to the Council draft (05125/2015),
- having regard to Article 150 of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union,
 pursuant to which the Council consulted Parliament (C8-0026/2015),
- having regard to Rule 59 of its Rules of Procedure,
- having regard to the report of the Committee on Employment and Social Affairs (A8-0065/2015),
- 1. Approves the Council draft;
- 2. Calls on the Council to notify Parliament if it intends to depart from the text approved by Parliament;
- 3. Asks the Council to consult Parliament again if it intends to substantially amend the text approved by Parliament;
- 4. Instructs its President to forward its position to the Council, the Commission and the national parliaments.
