1. *Welcomes the outcome of the first GST at COP28, which recognises that pathways limiting global warming to 1.5 °C with no or limited overshoot and to 2°C requires a peaking of global greenhouse gas emissions by 2025 and that limiting global warming to 1.5 °C with no or limited overshoot requires deep, rapid and sustained reductions in global GHG emissions of 43 % by 2030 and 60 % by 2035 relative to the 2019 level, reaching net zero GHG emissions by 2050;*

1. *Stresses that the largely ideologically motivated ‘climate policy’ as it stands should be ended; calls, therefore, for the EU’s current ‘climate policy’, in particular the European Climate Law and its ‘Fit for 55’ package, to be either revised or completely withdrawn in line with Article 3(3) of the Treaty on European Union, placing an emphasis on evidence-based and effective environmental protection in addition to balanced economic growth;*
