Considers that such a derogation should only apply to the treatment of individual animals with a clinically diagnosed serious, life-threatening disease which, if inappropriately treated, would lead to significant morbidity or significant mortality, and for which no alternative treatment, alternative farm management strategies or improved animal husbandry techniques to prevent, treat or control the disease are available, and should only apply subject to an antibiotic susceptibility test being required prior to treatment;

7. **Considers that** a derogation should apply to an individual treatment of individual animals after an individual diagnostic, including the performance of an antibiogram which leads to the result that no less potent antimicrobial is available; considers further that if several animals in the same setting are affected all of them may be treated but only under the condition mentioned above; stresses that the use of antimicrobials under these conditions should be notified to the competent national authorities and that Member States should collect and assess this data to allow for further recommendation and guidance on how to reduce the use of antimicrobials;
