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Written declaration, under Rule 136 of Parliament's Rules of Procedure, on the need for the Trans-European Transport Network (TEN-T) to support regional accessibility¹

- Article 4 of Regulation (EU) No 1315/2013 on Union guidelines for the development of the trans-European transport network (TEN-T) states that this network should aim to ensure accessibility for all regions and a balanced coverage of the European territory. Since 2014, implementation of this regulation has failed to achieve this objective: 90 % of the Connecting Europe Facility (CEF) funds allocated to transport have been earmarked for projects located along the nine priority corridors alone.
- 2. The outermost, peripheral and island regions have benefited only marginally from the possibilities offered by the TEN-T and CEF regulations. Moreover, they do not have as easy access as the central regions to funds under the Juncker Plan, which give priority to large-scale projects offering a quick return on investment.
- 3. The Commission is hence called upon to pay special attention to covering the whole of the territory of the Union when implementing the TEN-T and CEF between now and the end of the 2014-2020 programming period, in accordance with the principle of territorial cohesion. A detailed evaluation of the territorial impact of the results of the calls for projects under CEF-Transport in 2014 and 2015 could be carried out beforehand in order to provide an objective basis on which to draw up new guidelines.
- 4. This declaration, together with the names of the signatories, is forwarded to the Council and the Commission.
