Subject: Right to appeal state aid rulings

The Commission may instigate a state aid investigation based on a complaint made by interested parties against a Member State.

1. When the Commission conducts such a state aid investigation, is a Member State obliged to provide all documentation, such as internal unpublished reports, that may be material to the outcome of the case?
2. If such documentation is not presented, and the initial complainants feel that this omission has impacted the Commission's decision, is there a means for the initial complainants to appeal the Commission's ruling?
