Question for written answer E-002449/2024 to the Commission Rule 144 Markéta Gregorová (Verts/ALE)

Subject: Public authorities' compliance with the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR)

In Europe, countries such as Czechia (under Section 62(5) of Act No. 110/2019 Coll. on Personal Data Processing¹) are making use of the provision enshrined in Article 83(7) of Regulation (EU) 2016/679² (GDPR) to not impose any fines on public authorities. In its implementation report on GDPR, the Commission stated that fines have led private actors to 'take data protection seriously'³.

In light of the above:

- 1. Does the Commission consider it good practice to not impose fines on public authorities?
- 2. Will the Commission assess this specific issue in its future implementation reports?
- 3. Are discussions taking place with relevant bodies to establish guidance on public authorities' compliance with GDPR?
