Subject: Commission's ignorance of hate crimes against Christians

According to the Austrian NGO OIDAC, the number of hate crimes against Christians has increased by 44 % and arson attacks on or in churches by 75 % compared to 2021. For 2022, OIDAC documented 748 anti-Christian hate crimes in 30 different countries, ranging from arson attacks to threats¹. Astonishingly, the Commission makes no mention of this in its communication entitled 'No place for hate: a Europe united against hatred', though it does discuss hate against other religions or sexual minorities².

- 1. Why is absolutely no mention made of the significant increase in hate crimes against Christians in the Commission's communication entitled 'No place for hate: a Europe united against hatred'?
- 2. What data analyses and databases on the backgrounds and motives of those who incite hatred against Christians in any form does the Commission have?
- 3. If not currently available, does the Commission intend to collect such data in future?
