Subject: Recognition of market economy status for China: current state of play and potential impact

On 18 September 2015, the Economic Policy Institute published a study highlighting the socioeconomic consequences of granting market economy status to China. The report estimated that such a move would result in the loss of 3.5 million jobs in the EU, and a net loss for the European economy of up to 2 % of GDP. This disastrous scenario would bring millions of European families to their knees.

- 1. In light of this, can the Commission clarify what the next steps are likely to be in this regard?
- 2. Has it conducted an impact assessment of the socio-economic consequences of granting market economy status to China and is it aware of this study and of other studies on the consequences of recognising China as a market economy?
- 3. What is the position of the Commission on this issue?
