Subject: VP/HR - Follow-up on the Council's conclusions on Myanmar of 26 February 2018 and its decision 2018/655

In light of the widespread, systematic and grave human rights violations committed by Myanmar/Burma military and security forces in Rakhine State, the Council adopted decision 2018/655¹ establishing a legal framework for targeted sanctions against certain persons from the Myanmar Armed Forces and the border guard police.

The Council conclusions² invited Myanmar/Burma to seek accountability for the alleged crimes against humanity, mentioning a self-referral to the International Criminal Court pursuant to Article 12(3) of the Rome Statute. Sadly, the fourth Myanmar-EU Human Rights Dialogue's joint press release³ does not mention the EU raising these points.

The Myanmar Government's attempts to bury the evidence, as documented by Amnesty International⁴, show the need for an impartial, independent mechanism (IIM) to support investigations into the alleged atrocity crimes, focused on collecting and preserving evidence for inclusion in a master database for international criminal proceedings.

- 1. What is the timeline for the implementation of the restrictive measures, specifically establishing the list of targeted individuals?
- 2. Has the VP/HR been encouraging third countries, notably Australia, to follow suit, as mentioned in the Article 11 of the decision?
- 3. What steps is the EU/-VP/HR taking to press Myanmar/Burma to seek accountability and to support the establishment of the IIM?
