Subject: EU response to revisionism and invasions

The EU has quite rightly adopted a resolute and united stance against the Russian invasion of Ukraine, taking the necessary measures, imposing sanctions and thereby sending a strong message that it will not tolerate any infringement of international law, human rights and international legitimacy.

The Russian invasion of Ukraine concerns us all and we must all do our utmost to bring it to a halt in any way possible.

However, it is being matched by criminal acts of provocation committed by another invader on European territory, that is to say Turkey, which has been occupying Cyprus for 48 years.

If the EU is really determined to end invasions and teach invaders a firm lesson, its response must be the same in each case. It must put an end to both Russian and Turkish revisionism and their occupation of Ukraine and Cyprus respectively.

In view of this:

1. Can the Commission say whether the EU has drawn up a common plan to be implemented in response to any invasion?
2. How does it intend to respond to Turkish and Russian revisionism and invasions?
