Subject: Increase of funds under the EU budgetary framework for the EU Civil Protection

Mechanism

Europe and the world have been witnessing a decade of crisis: the COVID-19 pandemic, the war in Ukraine, deadly floods, historic wildfires and most recently the earthquakes in Türkiye and Syria. Though these events are very different, they have all had devastating consequences for both people and the environment. In these situations, rapid and targeted aid to the affected areas and victims is the most effective way to save lives and mitigate the consequences.
