Subject: Compatibility of the right of pre-emption with EU law

Article 193 of the Italian law¹ that transposed Directive (EU) 2014/23² provides for an 'award procedure' which enables promoters to exercise the right of pre-emption if they are not awarded a contract, thus granting them a competitive advantage and ultimately discouraging or inhibiting participation by other parties. The Commission had previously brought infringement proceedings against Italy on this matter, only for the Court of Justice of the European Union (CJEU)³ to declare the suit inadmissible on purely procedural grounds.

The Italian Council of State has reopened the matter by referring it to the CJEU for a preliminary ruling on the same point⁴.

In the light of the above:

- 1. Can the Commission say what measures it has taken in the wake of the above ruling, in particular whether it has obtained or intends to obtain data on the number of contracts awarded on the basis of this procedure and on the number of participants who were actually involved, with a view to verifying compliance with the principles of competition and transparency?
- 2. Does it believe that the right to pre-emption currently provided for by the award procedure laid down in Italy's Public Contracts Code is compatible with EU law?
