Subject: Neo-Nazi marches glorifying National Socialism in Budapest on the 'Day of Honour'

In February each year, neo-Nazi marches glorifying National Socialism are held in Budapest on the so-called 'Day of Honour'. This year once more, thousands of people, many of whom travelled from all over Europe, took part in a Waffen SS memorial march. Swastikas and Nazi symbols can be worn openly, and the march is state-sponsored through Hungarian Government ministries. Weapons, uniforms and Nazi memorabilia are officially provided by the Military History Museum.

- 1. Is the Commission aware of these marches and the Hungarian Government's support for them?
- 2. Is the Commission aware that the Hungarian authorities tolerate the use of symbols which are incompatible with the EU's fundamental rights?
- 3. What is the Commission doing to ensure respect for the EU's fundamental rights in Hungary during the so-called 'Day of Honour'?
