

SUGGESTIONS

The Committee on Civil Liberties, Justice and Home Affairs calls on the Committee on Budgetary Control, as the committee responsible, to incorporate the following suggestions into its motion for a resolution:

- 1. Welcomes the Court of Auditors' conclusions that the annual accounts of Eurojust present fairly its financial position on 31 December 2017 and that its transactions are legal and regular;
- 2. Welcomes the lack of remarks of the Court of Auditors regarding the execution of the 2017 budget of Eurojust; welcomes especially that most of the recommendations issued by the Courts of Auditors for previous years have been closed; highlights, in particular, that as from 2017 the Court of Auditors does no longer report excessive carry-overs of commitment appropriations from the previous year (2016) to the current year (2017) for Title II (expenditure for support activities);
- 3. Regrets that Eurojust does not publish all of its vacancy notices on the website of the European Personnel Selection Office (EPSO) but only on its own website and in social media; acknowledges the concerns of Eurojust with regard to additional translation costs due to the fact that EPSO requires publication of vacancy notices in all official languages but points out that there is only a limited number of vacancies concerned in the case of Eurojust; agrees with the Court of Auditors that this would be relevant and useful as EPSO publications increase transparency and publicity and allow Union citizens to identify vacancies published by the different Union institutions and agencies collectively; requests therefore that Eurojust also publishes its vacancy notices on the EPSO website; invites the Commission to consider measures aimed at reducing the financial burden for the translation of vacancy notices upon the agencies, including by establishing an ad hoc framework agreement with the Translation Centre for the Bodies of the European Union (CdT);
- 4. Recalls the importance and the added value of Eurojust in the fight against organised crime across Europe and, in particular, its role in funding Joint Investigation Teams(JITs); welcomes, in that regard, the recent conclusion of a new Memorandum of Understanding between Eurojust and Europol¹ laying down criteria and conditions for the financial support to JITs activities provided by both of them;
- 5. Regrets that the recommendation issued by the Court of Auditors in 2010 to reconsider the definition of respective roles and responsibilities between the Administrative Director and the College of Eurojust to avoid overlap of responsibilities resulting from the Founding Decision² was still open at the end of 2017; acknowledges that addressing this issue is not under the Eurojust's control but was under consideration by the collegislators in the context of the review of the Eurojust's mandate; welcomes the adoption of the new Eurojust Regulation³ and expects that these issues are resolved with
