Revisions to the European Union's Markets in Financial Instruments Directive, commonly known as MiFID II, go live in January and threaten to turn European equity trading upside down. The Great Unbundling

Perhaps the most influential aspect of the massive EU financial-markets legislation known as MiFID II is its provisions regarding how asset managers procure and pay for investment research. The MiFID II regime taking effect in January attempts to unbundle research payments from the commissions managers pay brokers for trade execution, which are drawn from client assets. Some of the world's biggest investors are responding by electing to directly absorb all research costs. Others will continue to pass them through to clients, but with an array of additional structure and disclosure required under the new rules. The impact of this Great Unbundling won't be limited to Europe, as global managers adopt MiFID II compliance as global best practices and brokers around the world prepare to feel the pain of less buy-side research spending. Our panel of research and regulatory professionals examines all these issues and what they will mean for market participants come January and beyond.
