



### **CHATHAM HOUSE RULE**

During the conference, the Chatham House Rule will be enforced:

"When a meeting, or part thereof, is held under the Chatham House Rule, participants are free to use the information received, but neither the identity nor the affiliation of the speaker(s), nor that of any other participant, may be revealed."

#### This means that:

- During the dissemination of information after the event, nothing should be done to identify, either explicitly or implicitly, who said what.
- This consideration should always guide the way in which event information is disseminated – online as well as offline. For example, a person tweeting about what has been said during the event, is only permitted to do so, if they do not identify – directly or indirectly - the speaker or another participant.
- You are allowed, however, to mention what you said yourself during the event.
- The list of participants should not be circulated beyond those participating in the event.
- No photos will be taken during the conference itself. At most, there will be pictures taken to capture the overall ambience.

The Chatham House Rule will **NOT** be enforced during the public event on 30 March at 6:30 pm where a photographer will be present.
