

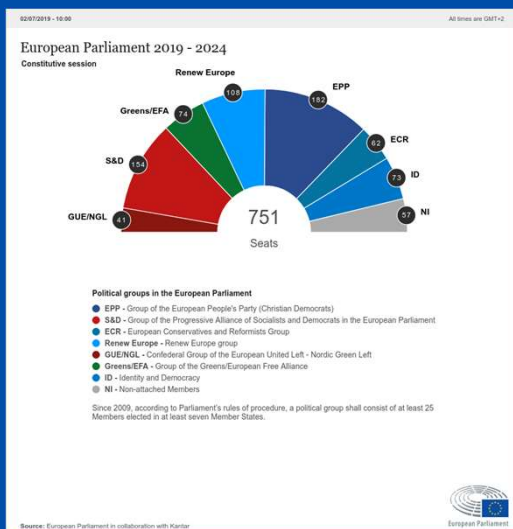
Election Night



'One-stop' access to election results data from all Member States.

Throughout Election Night (09 June), the European Parliament will continuously publish election results data from all Member States.

The data will be composed of publicly available information from the Member States, made available in a harmonised format.



The available data will be a mix of

- Estimates
- Partial results
- Provisional results
- Final results

Political parties will be affiliated to political groups in the European Parliament based on the structure of the outgoing Parliament.

Changes will be reflected after reception of an official, written declaration by the parties concerned.

Not officially affiliated parties will be categorised as 'Others'.

Availability of data on Election Night

tentative | based on 2019 European Elections

- 18:15:** first publication of available 'national estimates'
- 20:15:** first projection of full hemicycle based on available 'national estimates' and pre-election polls
- After 23:00:** first hemicycle with national estimates or provisional results from all 27 Member States

Updates until the Constitutive session

After the election night, the results are updated until final results are published in all Member States. Regular updates will be published on the website in accordance with the European Parliament.

After the constitutive session, a final update of the results will be published reflecting the final changes and composition of the European Parliament.

Timeline

- Website with historical results to be launched on 1st March 2024
- Three dress rehearsals with media in April/May 2024 (dates to be confirmed) to test data integration
- Updates with 2024 results data from 09 June 2024 until Constitutive session
- Closure and archival of the website at the end of September 2024

What data will be published?

At EU level

- Results by political groups (hemicycle)
- Breakdown by groups and countries (when 27 MS results are available)
- Breakdown by group, political parties and countries (when 27 MS results are available)
- Gender balance (afterwards)
- Turnout

At Member State level

- Results by political parties in %
- Results by political groups in seats
- Breakdown by political parties and EP groups
- Turnout
- Gender balance (later)
- Elected MEPs (at the first Constitutive session)

How can data be republished on third-party websites?

1. Embed a widget

From the 'Create a widget' page on the website, a small code to embed an iframe on a third-party website can be easily generated. The results included in the widget will be automatically updated during election night every time a new publication is available.

2. Use the datasheets (raw data)

We also provide 'raw data', which can be downloaded from the website and processed to be displayed on any other website. Types of data files will available: JSON, XML, CSV. Image formats: JPG and PNG.

These files will contain: historical results (available from the launch) and 2024 election results.

There will be a mechanism with digital signature to verify that the data file has not been manipulated by a third party during the publication process.
