BACKGROUND:

GIZ-German International Cooperation Agency- is a global service provider in the field of international cooperation for sustainable development dedicated to shaping a future worth living around the world. As a public benefit federal enterprise, GIZ supports the German government and in particular the Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ) in achieving their objective in international cooperation globally.

Since 2004, GIZ has been a trusted and reliable partner to the African Union (AU) to promote sustainable development. Cooperation in the field of digital transformation is a cornerstone of the AU-EU strategic partnership and a key component of the joint vision for sustainable economic growth.

It is against this background that the African Union Commission developed a high-level, principle-based [Data Policy Framework](#) for African countries to optimize the benefits of a data-driven economy. The Framework presents an enabling policy environment for the private and public investments necessary to support data-driven value creation and innovation. It is guided by the broad principles of value creation, transparency and accountability of institutions and actors, inclusion and participation of stakeholders, equity among citizens, and fair competition amongst market players necessary for data-value creation.

Within this frame of reference, AU and EU jointly engage to support the implementation of the framework on continental, regional and national level. Through the GIZ programme **DataCipation**, technical assistance is provided to the African Union Commission (AUC), its institutions and agencies such as the African Union Development Agency (AUDA-NEPAD) to support the roll out of the AU Data Policy Framework. The project DataCipation is part of the GIZ portfolio with the AU and is implemented in a team of diverse backgrounds in Addis Ababa and other locations.

In this context the GIZ Project, DataCipation seeks the services of a Data Policy Technical Advisor to support the African Union Development Agency (AUDA-NEPAD) with technical assistance in the implementation of the above project. The advisor will be embedded at

AUDA-NEPAD and based in Midrand, South Africa with regular business travel to the African Union Commission (AUC) in Addis Ababa and other AU member states.

A. RESPONSIBILITIES:

The Data Policy Technical Advisor will be embedded within AUDA-NEPAD and provide the organization with technical assistance to implement the AU Data Policy framework. The main responsibilities are as follows:

- Support the implementation of African Union's Digital Transformation Strategy for Africa 2030 and the Africa Union Data Policy Framework including:
 - Working with AU Member States to accelerate the implementation of the Data Policy Framework
 - Support development of Continental Open Data Strategy
 - Support development of cross border data flow mechanism
 - Assist in aligning regional instruments with Data Policy Framework
- Support cooperation between the African Union (e.g., AU Commission and AUDA-NEPAD) and the digital ecosystem actors in Africa and Europe

B. TASKS

The Data Policy Technical Advisor is expected to carry out the following tasks and advisory services (not exhaustive):

- Support the implementation of African Union's Digital Transformation Strategy for Africa 2030 and the Africa Union Data Policy Framework including:
 - Support development of Continental Open Data Strategy
 - Support development of cross border data flow mechanism
 - Assist in aligning regional instruments with Data Policy Framework
- Support cooperation between the African Union (e.g., AU Commission and AUDA-NEPAD) and the digital ecosystem actors in Africa and Europe
- Advise and provide technical assistance to the African Union Development Agency (AUDA-NEPAD), African Union Member states and Regional Economic Communities (RECs) on the development of a competitive regional digital economy and the implementation of the AU Data Policy Framework
- Advise on the development of policies to ensure adequate data protection, sharing, access and interoperability mechanisms in African Union member states.

- Work with government officials and policymakers to ensure that policies and regulations related to data governance and sharing are in line with the African Union Data Policy Framework
- Collaborate with stakeholders such as civil society organizations and private sector entities to promote the integration of the African Union Data Policy Framework into their operations.
- Organize delivery of training programs to stakeholders on data Governance and sharing best practices, and train data custodians within government agencies to create a cadre of data management experts.
- Monitor the implementation of the African Union Data Policy Framework across member states and provide regular status reports.
- Assist in preparation of studies and strategies and develop mechanisms for harmonizing and monitoring the progress of data strategies, policies and regulations at continental, regional and national level.
- Organize workshops, study trips and events that provide knowledge and experience-sharing on implementation of data policies and offer networking opportunities for stakeholders.
- Prepare and manage consultancy assignments and financing agreements and monitor service providers in completing their tasks.
- Initiate and foster partnerships with government, private sector, academia, and civil society actors across the AU and beyond for the project in data governance and regulation
- Stay up to date with global and regional data policies, regulations, and trends, and provide guidance to AUDA-NEPAD accordingly.
- Develop a strategy to raise awareness and make DPF implementation inclusive of all segments of society in line with the Digital Transformation Strategy (DTS) and Agenda 2063

C. REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS, COMPETENCIES AND EXPERIENCES

Qualifications:

- A master's degree in Economics, Political Science, Data Science, Information Systems, Computer Science, Public Policy, Development Studies, or any field relevant to data governance and digital development, ideally with research conducted in fields relevant to digital policy issues.

Professional Experience:

- Qualification should be enhanced by at least 4 years professional experience in the field of Digitalisation and/or Digital Policy and/or Digital Transformation and/or Data management and/or related areas in Africa.
- Relevant professional experience, preferably gained in Africa, on data policy, data governance and regulation, data management or related fields.

- Understanding of data protection and privacy laws, regulations, and best practice
- Experience working in government relations and particularly in multilateral organizations such as the African Union and its organs/specialised institutions is desirable.
- A good understanding of contemporary digital policy debates.
- In-depth knowledge of digital transformation and ICT/Information Systems governance tools such as the Information Systems Governance Framework, Information Governance and Management Framework and assessment tools.

Other Knowledge, Additional Competences:

- Knowledge of the African Union Digital Transformation Strategy, Agenda 2063, the AU Data Policy Framework, and continental institutional architecture
- Fluency in English language (orally and written) is required, Knowledge of French and/or other languages of the African Union is a strong asset.
- Service-oriented thinker with strong analytic and conceptual skills to provide professional and proactive support.
- Ability to work on multiple processes simultaneously.

Additional Skills Required:

- Carry outstanding work ethic and motivation to act reliable, dedicated, and disciplined without much guidance and supervision.
- Strong service-oriented thinker to provide professional and proactive advisory to GIZ and GIZ partner organisations.
- Brings intellectual curiosity, critical thinking, creativity, problem solving skills and ability to collaborate.
- Ability to work independent in a stressful and complex environment and be adaptive to change.
- Ability to work on multiple processes simultaneously and within a Team.
- Ability to communicate and act diplomatically.
- Previous working experience with GIZ and/or the public sector is an asset.
- Excellent IT Skills (Microsoft Office, MS Teams, data management and analysis).
- Excellent communication skills in business English (written, verbal).
