How to apply for a PhD

This will vary slightly depending on discipline but most successful applicants follow this path. Do NOT just apply online without doing steps 1 and 2.

1. Research our offering



2. Discuss your project



3. Apply

- Do we offer your specialism?
- Do we have the right supervisor for you?
- Do you meet the entry requirements?
- Why Queen Mary and why this group?
 - Is there space for a new PhD student in this group?
 - Does your CV/proposal interest the supervisor?
 - Can you win funding for this project?
 - Gather your documents
 - Hit apply!
 - Check if you need to make a second application for funding.



Our PhD Entry Requirements

These vary by School and programme and we judge all applications on individual merits.

But typically, we require:

- 1. At least a 2:1 UK Bachelors (or overseas equivalent)
- 2. And a Merit or Distinction in a relevant Masters
- 3. IELTS for non-English speaking countries (6.5-7.5 overall)
- Some subject areas will take students straight from a Bachelors if the grades are excellent and good research experience can be demonstrated
- Work and research experience will be considered
- Mature students are welcomed. Professional referees can be used in place of academic referees if you no longer have links with your university.


Timelines

- > Applications are open now
- Most applications close in January
- > Check the deadline if you are applying for external funding
- > You can expect a decision within 8 weeks of the deadline

NOTE: Law will close their QM studentships applications on **7**th **December**

25th January: Humanities & Social Sciences Studentships

S&E and **FMD** deadline throughout January...





Funding a PhD

You will need to fund:

- Tuition fees (~£25,000 for overseas students)
- Living costs (£1334/month)
- NHS surcharge (£470/year)



You can either:

- 1. Self-fund. This means you pay your fees to Queen Mary each year.
- 2. Apply for a studentship. This will cover your fees and living costs.



Funding a PhD

Most people fund their PhD through one of the following routes:

- 1. Research Council Studentships (Doctoral Training Partnerships or one-off grants)
- 2. QMUL Research Studentships
- 3. External scholarships (overseas governments, industrial sponsor, charities etc.)
- 4. Self funding (Tuition is £19-30k per year for overseas students)

You should discuss your funding plans with your supervisor/department before applying. The QM studentships do not require a separate application BUT you should make it clear that you are applying for this funding on your application.



Funding a PhD: Doctoral Training Programmes

- These are PhD programmes where you'll be part of a cohort of students based across several
 universities.
- You will received additional training and rotate around the other universities before settling at Queen Mary for your main project.
- Mostly for UK students but some have a small allocation for international students.
- Some require a separate application, some do not. Check!

Funding a PhD: QMUL Studentships

- Available in all subjects except Medicine/Dentistry
- International students are eligible
- No separate application
- Full tuition and living costs for 3 years
- Wait for publication of guidance before applying

Funding a PhD: Special International Schemes

In addition to the QMUL Studentships we have students funded by special international schemes

Some are fully external, some are co-funded with Queen Mary.
