### Bystander from the Northern Ohio Region Responds to Horrific Vehicle Crash

Tim Graichen witnessed a vehicle crash and roll over multiple times before landing in a median ditch. At the accident scene,





he instructed others to call 911 then managed to pull the driver away from the engine fire. The man was completely unresponsive. He was not breathing and had no signs of a pulse. A nurse arrived on the scene and Tim started rescue breathing while the nurse performed chest compressions. They alternated for more than ten minutes until medics arrived and took over. As the driver was being transported in the ambulance, an indication was given that EMS was able to get a pulse. The story, for which Tim was awarded the Certificate of Merit, is transfixing. The team then provided advanced resuscitation and care. The man was showing signs of improvement as they assisted with the medevac transport. 


