

Promote inclusion with the European Union programs for young people

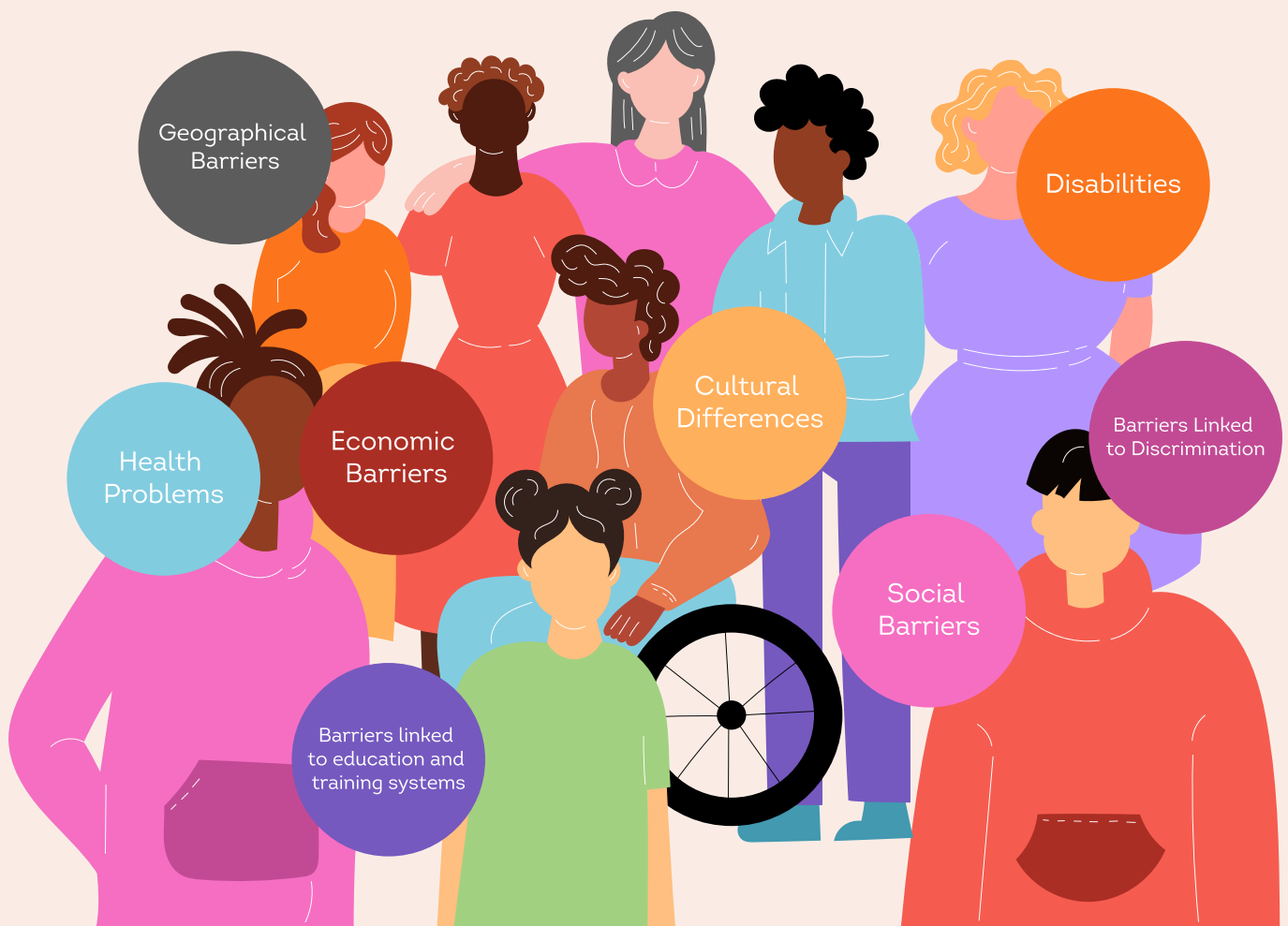
Go Inclusive!

For a **diverse** and **inclusive** European Union all young people should have access to international possibilities.

Erasmus+ and European Solidarity Corps offer ways to promote inclusive opportunities.

This support is for new organisations to the programs and organisations working with **young people with less chances in life**.



Who are young people with less chances in life?

Organisations, projects and activities for Erasmus+ and European Solidarity Corps should be accessible.

Erasmus+ is a program of the European Union It is about education, training young people and sports.

The European Solidarity Corps is also a program. Solidarity means helping other people. Many young people want to help other people. The European Solidarity Corps tells them where they can go to help.

Organisations can promote inclusion by contacting young people with less chances in life to let them know about European programs.

How can you make young people with less chances in life participate?

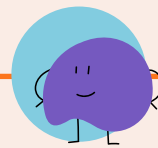


Exchanges for young people

Exchange gives young people the chance to meet other people from different countries.

Example

"[Roma \(S\)heroes](#)" workshops that bring together young Roma so they can raise information about their situation through theatre.





Participation to activities of young people

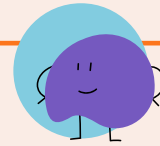
Erasmus+ supports project for young people to promote European values and rights.

Projects can also focus on developing young people's digital competences and understanding medias.

Activities for young people to participate can be international or national. It can be face-to-face or virtually.

The activities can be:

- Workshops
- Meetings
- Copy
- Campaigns
- Consultations



Example

Children without parents and people hiding from other countries connected all over Austria to be empowered.

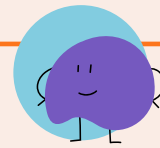
Participants created their own organization "Bunt", to have a say in Austrian and European politics.

European Solidarity Corps

The **European Solidarity Corps** program supports young people to do activities for the good of their local community. Volunteer projects can be individual or in groups.

Money is used for the preparation, to do activities, to do evaluation, to share information and make activities after.

To make these projects happen young people can have a coach to support them.



Example

The organisation called [De Wissel](#) hosts volunteers from the European Solidarity Corps program.

The organisation is in Belgium.

The organisation cares for young people.

The organisation gives care and coaching for girls who are in bad situations or children who have dropped out of school.

People can try out the many different activities and learn more about their interests and ideas.

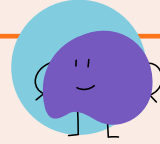


Mobility projects for young workers
