INTRODUCTION

This annex highlights over 1,000 key results achieved at the country and sub-regional levels, with the support of UNFPA in 2023. It covers results only at the country programme output level. These results include (a) changing the laws, policies, plans, strategies, programmes and accountability frameworks; (b) developing and adjusting the national and subnational systems and tools; (c) strengthening the skills and capacities of duty-bearers and service providers; and (d) ensuring immediate benefits for the rights-holders.

The results reported here are limited to a maximum of six per country even though a country may have achieved more than six results. The UNFPA support is defined mainly as technical or financial support to a country. In some instances, however, the support is in the form of coordination.

RESULT 1

The civil registration and vital statistics system was scaled up, extending the registration of births and deaths to six more districts



RESULT 2

The use of digital platforms for the maternal death audit system was expanded to 32 districts



RESULT 3

Capacity was developed at 30 district-level departments of the Ministry of Health on use of the clinical management framework for women survivors of violence



RESULT 4

The national sexual and reproductive health data system was digitized



RESULT 5

Family and social mediation capacities of 40 per cent of the Ministry of Solidarity district level units were improved



RESULT 6

The quality and accessibility of indicator data for the Sustainable Development Goals was enhanced, making data readily available on the website of the National Statistical Office

RESULT 1

The first one stop gender-based violence centre in the country was launched at the Balbala Hospital



RESULT 2

The pilot phase of the 3rd General Population and Housing Census was implemented by the Institute of Statistics of Djibouti



RESULT 3

The first electronic logistic management information system in health structures was operationalized, strengthening capacities of 47 health service providers in the management of logistics



RESULT 4

A national strategy for accelerating the reduction of maternal and neonatal mortality 2022–2026 was developed and operationalized



RESULT 5

The first national strategy to address gender-based violence was developed



RESULT 6

The health system in Djibouti was reformed by strengthening the institutional capacities for offering sexual and reproductive health services

Key Results Achieved in 2023



RESULT 1

Over 7,300 girls were empowered through social, health and economic assets



RESULT 2

The safe women clinics model, which offers comprehensive medical care and psychological and counselling services, was expanded to reach a total of 15 university hospitals



RESULT 3

Capacities were strengthened for 253 medical service providers to offer comprehensive violence against women case management, protection services and referrals as part of improving the medical response to gender-based violence in the public health sector



RESULT 4

3,581 women and girls survivors of violence accessed specialized services offered through the national services



RESULT 5

A unified curriculum was developed for medical students in universities for the elimination of female genital mutilation



RESULT 6

An investment case was developed that determined the cost of ending the unmet need for family planning by 2030 and related benefits, serving as an important advocacy tool for increasing public investment and promoting private financing partnerships

Key Results Achieved in 2023



RESULT 1

A population policy was developed with the support from UNFPA



RESULT 2

A national family planning costed action plan was developed jointly with the Ministry of Health to strengthen access to rights-based family planning with a focus on young people and vulnerable groups



RESULT 3

A maternity intensive care unit was established at the Aldiwanya Maternity Hospital, benefiting over 227,000 individuals in 2023 who previously had limited access to such services



RESULT 4

Ten reproductive health clinics were strengthened to deliver essential sexual and reproductive health services to refugees and internally displaced persons residing in 10 different camps. The clinics served over 1,905 individuals in 2023



RESULT 5

A national behaviour change communication strategy and action plan was developed to enhance reproductive health literacy and service update among women and girls



RESULT 6

Around 11,900 young people benefited from life skills, citizenship education and other youth programmes designed to prevent violent extremism

Key Results Achieved in 2023



RESULT 1

Results of the first-ever needs assessment on emergency obstetric and newborn care (EmONC) were published, providing evidence on the current availability, utilization and quality of EmONC services in the country



RESULT 2

A Youth, Peace and Security (YPS) unit was established within the Ministry of Youth



RESULT 3

More than 321,700 women, adolescents and youth, including those with disabilities, benefited from quality sexual and reproductive health and gender-based violence prevention and response services



RESULT 4

UNFPA supported integrating cash assistance into gender-based violence case management, reaching 288 individuals. Analysis of the 2022 cash and voucher assistance data showed that 93 per cent of women reported that cash assistance mitigated immediate gender-based violence risks and 88 per cent reported that the cash assistance increased their access to urgent gender-based violence services



RESULT 5

Over 53,000 women and girls benefited from gender-based violence prevention and response services



RESULT 6

Comprehensive, high-quality sexual and reproductive health services were provided at Zaatari camp through three clinics. Each month, approximately 5,000 people received services, including an average of four safe deliveries a day. Since opening in August 2013, the maternity clinic has overseen more than 17,000 safe deliveries with no maternal newborn deaths reported as of December 2023

The Commission on Lebanese Women developed a National Strategy for Women 2022–2030, which is the main policy instrument for gender equality and women empowerment in the country



RESULT 2

A national strategy for persons with disabilities was developed



RESULT 3

A maternal mortality report for 2020–2022 was launched



RESULT 4

Standard operating procedures were developed to improve clinical management of rape services in Lebanon



RESULT 5

A framework on adolescent and youth sexual and reproductive health was introduced as a tracking tool that provides policymakers with a road map with relevant interventions



RESULT 6

A menstrual hygiene management guidance was introduced

Key Results Achieved in 2023



RESULT 1

Pre-service, post-nursing and Bachelor of Science in midwifery curricula and lesson plans were developed, in addition to a national nursing and midwifery regulatory framework to assist the National Health Council and Midwifery Council in regulating nursing and midwifery services



RESULT 2

A pool of family planning master trainers was introduced to roll out family planning services in public health facilities



RESULT 3

In the aftermath of cyclone-like Storm Daniel, Libya updated the common operational dataset for population statistics. The dataset was used as the main source of data to estimate the size of the affected population and the number of people in need of humanitarian assistance in the country



RESULT 4

Over 73,000 vulnerable people, including 7,561 internally displaced people, benefited from high-quality sexual and reproductive health services



RESULT 5

The UNFPA mentorship programme expanded to 23 health facilities and supported the services of 194 midwives to improve the quality of midwifery care in primary health-care facilities and empower midwives in tertiary hospitals



RESULT 6

A mental health learning resource package was developed to train specialized groups of nurses in the provision of critical mental health services

RESULT 1

A new 2024 census methodology based on digitalization was developed by the Haut-Commissariat au Plan



RESULT 2

A new national strategy for the elimination of preventable maternal deaths 2023–2027 was operationalized through regional action plans



RESULT 3

A new master's degree in "leadership and management in sexual and reproductive health" was launched, attached to one of the leading nursing institutes



RESULT 4

An operational plan for sexual and reproductive health in prisons was elaborated by UNFPA, in collaboration with the General Delegation for Penitentiary Administration and with the support from the Ministry of Health



RESULT 5

The National School for Public Health launched an e-learning course on the Minimum Initial Service Package (MISP) for sexual and reproductive health in crisis situations



RESULT 6

The Arab Youth Charter was launched as a youth initiative conducted in collaboration with the Ministry of Youth, Culture and Communication, aimed at strengthening advocacy efforts to ensure youth participation in the development, implementation and evaluation of public policies

RESULT 1

The Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW) report for Bahrain was launched. Sexual and reproductive health and rights issues, including the rights to access information and services and comprehensive sexuality education, were highlighted in the report



RESULT 2

A cervical cancer study was initiated with the World Health Organization and the Ministry of Health of Oman to assess the prevalence and genotypes of human papilloma virus (HPV) infection among Omani women



RESULT 3

The Ministry of Health of Oman launched the National Non-Communicable Diseases Forum in 2023

RESULT 1

An obstetric fistula national strategy was launched, focused on eliminating all obstetric fistula in Somalia



RESULT 2

A national family planning plan 2023–2028 was developed for the first time, along with a reproductive health commodity security road map



RESULT 3

A new midwifery strategy was developed at national level. UNFPA also launched a sexual and reproductive health and rights mobile application in the Somali language, aimed at promoting the utilization of midwifery provision services in Somalia



RESULT 4

Around 410,000 people utilized different integrated sexual and reproductive health services including in the humanitarian settings



RESULT 5

The Somaliland government launched the National Development Plan (NDPIII) 2023 – 2027, which integrates sexual and reproductive health and population dynamics



RESULT 6

Census regulations for the Somali Population and Housing Census were endorsed by the Census Core technical team. This document provides a legal basis for undertaking the Somali Population and Housing Census at national and state levels

Key Results Achieved in 2023



RESULT 1

UNFPA and partners delivered life-saving medicines and equipment that supported more than half of the births – 21,000 – in Gaza since war began on 7 October



RESULT 2

In 2023, 972 youth (436 females, 536 males) were engaged in and participated in the decision-making mechanisms in Youth, Peace and Security (YPS) initiatives



RESULT 3

The Palestinian Higher Council of Youth and Sport developed the National Youth Strategy (2024–2029)



RESULT 4

Over 182,000 women, adolescents and youth, including people with disabilities, received high-quality services related to sexual and reproductive health, prevention and protection from gender-based violence



RESULT 5

The national gender-based violence referral pathway system was updated



RESULT 6

UNFPA chaired the gender-based violence sub-cluster at national level in Gaza and in the West Bank, and also led the sexual and reproductive health working group in Gaza

RESULT 1

Over 333,000 people benefited from sexual and reproductive health services in 2023



RESULT 2

Over 18,300 women and girls benefited from dignity kits in Geneina and Armada, West Darfur and Kassala, Central Darfur, North Darfur, Gedarif, Red Sea, White Nile and Blue Nile locations



RESULT 3

108 community midwives in five states, including the midwives working in humanitarian locations, improved their knowledge and skills through in-service training using the updated in-service training curriculum



RESULT 4

1,822 cases of obstetric fistula were repaired



RESULT 5

Over 9,400 individuals from key populations in the targeted states were reached with the human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) prevention package, and more than 8,000 individuals from key populations were tested for HIV and received their results



RESULT 6

Over 250,000 women and girls in host communities and internally displaced and refugee settings benefited from gender-based violence support services in 2023. In addition, 54 Women and Girls Safe Spaces were established in the country

RESULT 1

A climate change toolkit was developed and green initiatives were supported through youth programming, taking an approach that emphasized the role of youth in contributing to climate action and sustainability



RESULT 2

A network of trained psychosocial support service providers was established to respond to the needs of gender-based violence survivors



RESULT 3

A gender equality plan was endorsed by the Government



RESULT 4

Over 180 service delivery points were strengthened with a comprehensive range of sexual and reproductive health services and information dissemination, benefiting more than one million women and girls



RESULT 5

Over 665,400 women and girls benefited from gender-based violence prevention and response services through collaborative efforts with 20 non-governmental organizations



RESULT 6

530 communities across 14 governorates benefited from a comprehensive approach that ensured the availability of high-quality reproductive health services without stigma and discrimination

RESULT 2

A national Minimum Initial Service Package (MISP) readiness assessment was conducted. The findings informed a preliminary national action plan for MISP preparation



RESULT 3

A harmonized framework for sexual and reproductive health youth-friendly services was developed



RESULT 4

UNFPA supported the provision of gender-based violence care services through seven safe spaces/shelters for 1,091 women survivors of violence



RESULT 5

The national review report on International Conference on Population and Development (ICPD) commitment implementation in Tunisia was made available, in anticipation of the regional conference for the sixth review of the ICPD Programme of Action



RESULT 6

The National Statistics Institute georeferenced database was reviewed and updated to improve the quality and accuracy of the database

RESULT 1

A Midwifery Strategy and a Maternal Neonatal Health Strategy was launched to reduce maternal and neonatal mortality in Yemen



RESULT 2

Over 108,500 survivors of gender-based violence were provided with case management services, including psychosocial support, medical, legal and cash assistance, in 19 targeted governorates



RESULT 3

116,964 safe deliveries were assisted



RESULT 4

Over 290,793 people benefited with specialized mental health services, and eight specialized mental health centres were strengthened in 2023



RESULT 5

Over 1,229,600 people benefited from reproductive health services, and approximately 95 health facilities were improved to deliver reproductive health services



RESULT 6

300 individuals completed pre-service training and on-the-job training for midwives

Key Results Achieved in 2023



RESULT 1

Over 2.25 million people benefited from maternal and reproductive health services through 435 midwifery-led family health houses established with the support of UNFPA



RESULT 2

Over 4.3 million beneficiaries were reached with sexual and reproductive health services through 200 mobile health teams supported by UNFPA



RESULT 3

277 service providers, including 157 women, were trained to improve the delivery of quality services in the Minimum Initial Service Package (MISP), and an additional 1,483 women front-line workers were trained to provide quality psychosocial support counselling and services



RESULT 4

Over 1.68 million women and girls received psychosocial support counselling and services through 78 Women Friendly Health Spaces and 46 psychosocial support counselling centres in 29 provinces



RESULT 5

Around 273,000 young people were reached with integrated youth-friendly services including pre-marriage counselling from 114 health service delivery points strengthened with UNFPA support



RESULT 6

Around 150,000 young people received adolescent and youth-friendly reproductive health information, counselling and referral services through a youth healthline

Key Results Achieved in 2023



RESULT 1

The first ever Bangladesh National Family Planning Strategy (2023–2030) was developed by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare



RESULT 2

District Action Plans to end child marriage were developed and endorsed by four districts. The development of the action plans was guided by the National Action Plan to End Child Marriage



RESULT 3

A tailored Comprehensive Sexuality Education Curriculum for out-of-school adolescent girls was developed, including components for married adolescent girls



RESULT 4

With support from UNFPA and Dalarna University, a master's programme in midwifery was developed. Two nursing colleges have been approved to start the master's programme in 2025



RESULT 5

In collaboration with the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, a national guideline addressing son preference and gender-biased sex selection was developed and shared



RESULT 6

The Ministry of Health integrated the Minimum Initial Service Package (MISP) into the 5th Health Sector Operational Plan

RESULT 1

The national policy on prevention and response to sexual violence was developed



RESULT 2

An integrated national reproductive maternal neonatal child and adolescent health strategy was developed with inputs from the World Health Organization and UNICEF



RESULT 3

The pre-service training curriculum for midwives was updated to include mental health topics in the antenatal, postnatal and perinatal programme



RESULT 4

The Senior Citizen Policy was launched



RESULT 5

A training package on standardized social messaging to prevent and address gender-based violence and issues related to sexual and reproductive health and rights was developed and disseminated through mask dances during the Druk Gi Tsechu Garcham Gi Sheba festival



RESULT 6

A virtual learning education platform to undertake a comprehensive sexuality education course in the local language was developed and made available for undergraduate and postgraduate students taking national language course in two colleges (Paro and Taktse)

Key Results Achieved in 2023



RESULT 1

Health sector response to gender-based violence was improved through development and implementation of service delivery standards guidelines; 887 gender-based violence survivors benefitted from the services



RESULT 2

The Cambodia Strategic Framework and Action Plan 2024–2030 for the Implementation of the ICPD National Voluntary Commitments was developed, outlining a clear roadmap for national policy and programmatic actions



RESULT 3

The Ministry of Education, Youth and Sport operationalized the national curriculum on health education and comprehensive sexuality education in 433 lower secondary schools across eight target provinces, enhancing the capacity of the education system to deliver essential life skills education to school-based young people. In addition, 48,300 users registered in the Ministry’s “Youth Health” mobile app launched by MOEYS



RESULT 4

The National Maternal and Child Health Centre of the Ministry of Health updated the family planning guidelines, protocols and training materials to incorporate ICPD25 national commitments and human rights-based principles, ensuring that 341 health-care providers are well-equipped to deliver high-quality, rights-based family planning services



RESULT 5

Ensuring that no one is left behind, 10,075 Female Entertainment Workers (FEWs) were provided with information about human rights-based family planning and other essential sexual and reproductive health services, enabling 480 FEWs to receive related health services. More than 1,500 FEWs registered in the national social protection schemes, ensuring their access to broader social protection and health benefits



RESULT 6

Cambodia rolled out a new competency-based curriculum for an associate’s degree in midwifery in all six targeted public midwifery schools, thereby enhancing the quality of midwifery education and ensuring that future midwives are well-prepared to provide high-standard maternal and newborn care

CHINA 2023

Key Results Achieved in 2023



RESULT 1

Within the framework of the South-South cooperation Guinea, Mauritania and Senegal, the survey on behaviour change to stop female genital mutilation enabled the assessment of the qualitative and quantitative approaches used by the partner non-governmental organizations implementing the UNFPA–UNICEF Joint Programme on the Elimination of Female Genital Mutilation



RESULT 2

The National Population Policy was updated and validated with the integration of the country commitments for ICPD25 and aligned with the five-year plan of the Accelerated Growth and Shared Prosperity Strategy 2021–2025



RESULT 3

A national integrated reproductive health strategy was developed



RESULT 4

Over 1,000 women and girls exposed to gender-based violence in humanitarian areas were reached with GBV prevention and case management services, life skills training and dignity kits



RESULT 5

100 service delivery points were equipped with family planning product management tools including stock sheets, delivery notes, order forms and temperature monitoring sheets



RESULT 6

200 service providers were trained on-site in reproductive health product logistics management tools

RESULT 1

175 health centres were upgraded to offer basic emergency obstetric care, meeting the 2023 targets of 149



RESULT 2

Reproductive Health Education for Adolescents and Young People was implemented throughout the country, in school and in non-school settings



RESULT 3

Over 568,000 new users of modern contraceptives were reported



RESULT 4

The Government institutionalized the School Health Clubs by joint decree of the Ministry of National Education and that of Public Health, Population and Social Affairs



RESULT 5

The Association of Midwives of Niger updated the register of midwifery practitioners in the whole country through a digital platform



RESULT 6

125 safe spaces were set up in Niamey (5), Maradi (23), Tillabéri (29), Zinder (29) and Tahoua (39)

RESULT 1

The revised National Gender Policy was launched to provide a framework for gender programming and increased multisectoral capacity



RESULT 2

The National Contraceptives Logistics Management System guidelines and tools were updated to align with the current need to improve accountability and visibility across the family planning commodity supply chain management system



RESULT 3

The National Guidelines on Maternal, Perinatal and Child Death Surveillance and Response in Nigeria were launched



RESULT 4

The Medical and Dental Council of Nigeria updated their Code of Ethics to reflect the recognition of female genital mutilation as a harmful practice against medical ethics



RESULT 5

42 communities publicly declared the abandonment of female genital mutilation in Imo and Ebonyi states by engaging 86 religious leaders and community/traditional influencers to denounce FGM

103,359 individuals were reached with essential reproductive health services and referrals

RESULT 1

The National Plan for the Supply of Reproductive Health Products for 2022–2026 was developed



RESULT 2

A database was launched in Sao Tome and Principe with key population data in the country



RESULT 3

Around 30,000 people accessed essential sexual and reproductive health services



RESULT 4

A system for tracking and monitoring national commitments was integrated into the Ministry of Finance, Planning and Blue Economy



RESULT 5

20 professionals from the national police and the counselling centre against domestic violence were trained on gender-based violence



RESULT 6

57 per cent (target 47 per cent for 2023) of districts established a multi-stakeholder coordination mechanisms on adolescents and youth

The Government made a formal commitment to subsidize the cost of treatment for obstetric fistulas

90 per cent of service delivery points did not experience a stock-out of contraceptive products in the last six months in 2023



RESULT 4

Over 30,000 adolescents and youth, including young people with disabilities, benefited from high-quality services related to sexual and reproductive health



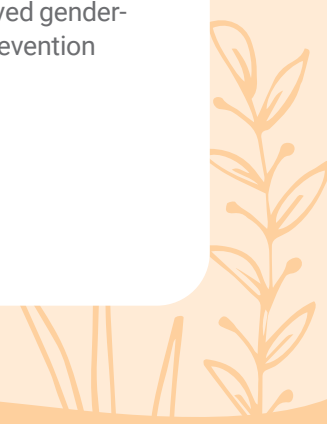

Key Results Achieved in 2023



RESULT 1

The Gender Equality and Women’s Empowerment Act of 2022 was operationalized



RESULT 2

Skilled birth attendance in Sierra Leone increased by 15 per cent following the graduation and deployment of 260 additional midwives to health facilities across the country



RESULT 3

99.3 per cent of all service delivery points offered at least three modern contraceptive methods



RESULT 4

A 10 per cent reduction in the number of maternal deaths in the country was recorded through the maternal death surveillance and response system



RESULT 5

55 per cent of women were estimated to have their demand for family planning met with a modern method, an increase from 45 per cent in 2019



RESULT 6

7,971 marginalized girls, including girls with disabilities, were saved from child marriage through the safe spaces programme

A gender and human rights action plan for the HIV response was validated and made available to guide future actions

An action plan was developed on Adolescent Health



RESULT 4

Over 662,900 young people (358,225 girls and 304,669 boys) were reached by an e-friendly application that provided online advice and guidance on sexual and reproductive health



RESULT 5

5,991 new family planning users were reached by two mobile clinics offering family planning services in the Maritime and Savanes



RESULT 6

Over 1,900 people benefited from services provided by 18 counselling centres for survivors of gender-based violence
