



I am so proud to have been a part of WEIU's "Charleston, This is Our Story." I have been amazed at the number of people, both good friends and people I hardly knew, who have come up to me and said, "I saw you on TV on the Charleston Story, you did a nice job," and then went on to say how much they enjoyed the whole program. I think the program brought this community together in a way that I cannot remember before.

Jana Johnson came to my rescue and offered to go to the library with me and take photographs, which she did. I got to know Jana a little and came to think of her as my friend and supporter in this project.

When I went to the studio the day of the filming, she and Rameen put me at ease and made the whole thing seem simple and fun.
